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SOME OF THE EXCITING SITES YOU WILL VISIT

Trip to the Dead Sea

Your drive to the Dead Sea, the lowest point on Earth, is via the Qumran National Park, the location where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found and the ancient home of the Jewish sect of Essenes. Continue along the coast of the Dead Sea to Masada, home to a group of ancient palaces and fortifications on top of an isolated rock plateau. Ascend to the top via cable car, tour the famous mountain fortress ruins, and visit the excavations of Herod's Palace, the Roman Bathhouse, and the Byzantine Church. Your tour continues south to Ein Bokek, the hotel area on the Dead Sea. Have a buffet lunch at Isrotel Dead Sea and then enjoy the spa facilities and beach, including floating on the salty waters and a 30 minute personal spa treatment. Showers and changing rooms are available within the spa facilities.

Tel Aviv/Jaffa tour

Starting your tour at the Clock Square, a well-known landmark of the ancient port city of Jaffa, visit the famous artists quarter and the Wishing Bridge (stand on the bridge, hold your zodiac sign while facing the sea, and make a wish). Continue into Tel Aviv's fashionable Neve Tzedek neighborhood and see the old and the new sides of the area. Stop for lunch at the Nana Restaurant or choose from one of the many local eateries. Continue on to Ahuzat Bayit, site of the original homestead that became Tel Aviv. View some of the classic Bauhaus architecture and learn why the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) has recognized Tel Aviv's White City as a World Cultural Heritage site. Your tour continues into modern Tel Aviv.

















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Zichron Yaakov

Your first stop in your tour of the Zichron Yaakov area will be a Roman aqueduct, built to bring water from from springs at the foot of Mount Carmel, almost 10 miles away. In Zichron, you can wander around the pedestrian mall and discover the small shops that line the streets and courtyards of this picturesque town. Visit the Beit Aharonson museum and learn about the secret Nili underground organization, a Jewish espionage network that assisted the United Kingdom in its fight against the Ottoman Empire during World War I. Your tour continues with a visit to a winery in the nearby town of Binyamina before returning to Tel Aviv.

Jeep tour

Start your 4×4 tour with a view of the Judean Plain and the vineyards of the Barkan Winery, the second biggest producer of wine in Israel. The region, with its rich soil, is known for its grapes, which are used for fine wines. Learn the history of the region and the many events from the Bible that occurred on the Plain, including the story of Goliath and the ancient Philistines. Continue to a huge quarry site, where you visit a bell cave and an impressive columbarium. See how three great religions left their mark on the same location. Your day ends with a wine tasting and tour of a winery at the Mesoa Ridge.

Sea of Galilee tour

Your trip to the Sea of Galilee (Kinneret) area starts with a tour of Megiddo, site of an ancient city in northern Israel's Jezreel Valley, also considered to be the location of the future Armageddon. Continue to Nazareth, the childhood home of Jesus, with many shrines commemorating biblical events. Visit the Church of the Annunciation and see the world's largest collection of images of Jesus and Mary. Drive past the village of Cana in the Galilee, where Jesus performed the miracle of changing water into wine, and proceed to the beautiful Sea of Galilee. On its shores, visit the Mt. of Beatitudes, the site of the Sermon on the Mount, Tagbha (miracle of loaves and fishes), and Capernaum, location of an ancient synagogue and Jesus' ministry. Enjoy lunch at a Lebanese restaurant along the shores of the Sea of Galilee. Return to Tel Aviv by way of Tiberius, an ancient city named after the Emperor Tiberias and a popular holiday resort, as well as Yardenit, the famous baptismal site, where the Sea of Galilee flows into the Jordan River and where Christian pilgrims come from all over the world to be baptized.









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Jerusalem tour

Your tour of Jerusalem concentrates on the historic areas in and around the Old City. You start with a breathtaking view of Jerusalem and the Temple Mount esplanade from the Mount of Olives. Continue on to the Church of All Nations and the adjacent Garden of Gethsemane, which according to the New Testament is the place where Jesus and his disciples prayed the night before Jesus' crucifixion. Descend the mountain and go to the nearby Mount Zion, where you visit the Cenacle (Upper Room), location of Jesus' last supper and Hagia Maria Sion Abbey (Abbey of the Dormition). From there follow the 500-year-old city ramparts to the Davidson Center and view a new visitors center that describes the history of the Temple. Afterwards, visit the Western Wall (Kotel), the retaining wall of the Temple and Judaism's holiest site. From the Western Wall, walk through the colorful Arab souk (bazaar) to the Christian Quarter and the Stations of the Cross the Via Dolorosa — and visit the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. Exit the Old City via the popular Jaffa Gate.









The Da Vinci Code tour in Jerusalem

This is an alternate tour for anyone who has already visited Jerusalem. Enjoy a fascinating tour following the mysteries from Dan Brown's well-known book and movie, *The Da Vinci Code*. Was Mary Magdalene a saint? Did she give birth to offspring and continue Jesus' lineage? What happened to the women who were by the side of Jesus at the crucial moments in his life and crucifixion? The tour takes you to Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu, Tomb of David and the Upper Room (location of the last supper).










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
